FEES

The Fairfield Foundation charges a \$200/week fee for each intern. <u>Please include a check made payable to the Fairfield Foundation after you schedule the period of your internship. PLEASE NOTE:</u> the fees *do not* cover personal expenses, such as food, personal items, or housing (see below). Interns are expected to cover these costs. The fee is fully refundable if the internship is cancelled more than two weeks prior to starting.

HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION

Housing is the responsibility of each intern, though the Fairfield Foundation is happy to recommend nearby lodging options. Host families are occasionally available at low or no cost, often on a first-come, first-served basis. Host families will often provide some meals and other needs, but interns should be prepared to cover their own personal expenses. Personal transportation is encouraged, but assistance with transportation to/from Gloucester and from your lodging to the lab/site may be available. Please contact us for more information.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Fairfield Foundation is committed to ensuring that all students have equal access to our internship program. To reduce or eliminate financial barriers we offer assistance that may include a waiver of the internship fee (\$200), assistance with transportation (up to \$300/internship), and/or housing (up to \$500/week). Assistance is dependent on available funding. BIPOC, economically disadvantaged, and first-generation college students are especially encouraged to apply. Please contact us for more information.
